IN THE CITY... TICK IT WHEN YOU FIND IT

A COBWEB

Cobwebs are made of silk. They are elastic and very lightweight, but they are also very strong. Spiders use them as a trap to catch the flies and mosquitoes that they eat.



A HEDGE

Its bushes are the perfect shelter for insects and small animals.



A PARK

For people who live in the city, parks provide a little piece of nature near to home. Green spaces are very important because they are good for your health and provide a nicer everyday environment.



A WILD PLANT

These sometimes grow between 2 walls or on the edge of pavements.

A SMALL LIVING CREATURE

If it's raining you might find a snail, or maybe an insect like an ant or beetle.



A TREE WITH LEAVES

Trees in the city help reduce air pollution because they absorb CO2 and release oxygen. They also provide shelter for birds and insects. In winter, only evergreen trees will still have their leaves.



A SHARED VEGETABLE PLOT

These are vegetable patches that local residents share to grow seasonal fruits and vegetables.



A POT PLANT

Look for these on balconies or apartment windows. Pot plants and flowers attract foraging bees.
